About the Dietetics, Diabetes Education and Community Nursing team

Sitting within the Community Partnerships Directorate, the Dietetics, Diabetes Education and Community Nursing Team provides high quality health and care coordination services to clients and community groups of YourCH, their families/carers, support workers and other professionals. The team sits within the multi-disciplinary Allied Health Program and consists of dedicated and skilled clinicians and Allied Health Assistant. As part of YourCH we are passionate and enthusiastic staff working towards our vision of a health and wellbeing for everyone and creating an environment that is inclusive and representative of the communities in which we serve.

Position Purpose

The Community Health Nurse provides high quality primary nursing care that is especially tailored to reaching priority population groups in our community. This role will offer person-centred comprehensive care management and support with individuals and groups, on-site and in community settings, across a range of funding sources including Integrated Chronic Disease Management and Community Health Program. This role's model of care ensures that chronic disease self-management, contemporary health promotion, and wellness and reablement principles are applied through a social model of health.

This role involves building multi-disciplinary relationships and working closely with the broader Allied Health team, YourCH Programs (including Primary Care, Community Programs, Gender Affirming Care), other community-based services, acute setting partners and other agencies (e.g. Health Independence Programs) to actively facilitate access YourCH services for clients with chronic and complex conditions (including diabetes, mental health, asthma and COPD).

Position responsibilities

- Deliver safe and high-quality care in complex care assessment, care planning, intervention and management of clients, their carers and priority community groups/populations (on-site, at home or in other community settings), as part of a multi-disciplinary, person-centred service.
- Develop and monitor clients' care plans and assist in goal identification by working with clients, their family, GPs, Primary Care nurses, and other health professionals to ensure the client is supported in the community.
- Apply skills in client self-management, health coaching and motivational interviewing in therapeutic intervention approaches with clients, especially those with chronic and complex needs.
- Build positive relationships, internal and external to YourCH, to facilitate collaborative personcentred care, including but not limited to Darebin Youth Hub, First Nations agencies, and Refugee and migrant services.
- Actively participate in evaluating client progress, using relevant outcome measures and discuss outcomes with clients and stakeholders.
- Participate in developing, delivering and evaluating innovative, evidence-based community nursing services and health promotion initiatives that are responsive to community needs (e.g. facilitation of multi-disciplinary peer-education groups).
- Actively participate in developing, implementing and evaluating of services by the Dietetics,







- Diabetes Education and Community Nursing team.
- Actively participate in regular professional and clinical supervision and professional development programs that support clinicians, staff and students.

Position requirements (qualifications, skills, knowledge and attributes)

Qualifications, Registration and Licenses

- A qualification as a Registered Nurse Division 1
- Registration with AHPRA as a registered nurse
- Current Victorian Drivers Licence.
- Smoking Cessation Worker trained (desirable).

Knowledge, Experience, Skills and competencies

- At least 3 years clinical nursing experience in a community setting with well-developed comprehensive complex care assessment, care plan development and care management skills.
- Demonstrated ability to provide nursing care for a variety of client groups and conditions in a community setting with individuals and in groups particularly adults with physical, intellectual, or psycho-social disability; adults with chronic and complex conditions; adults who are frail; and young people.
- Demonstrated experience in applying client self-management, health coaching and/or motivational interviewing techniques, to support clients especially those with chronic and complex needs.
- Strong commitment and demonstrated application of nursing care through a social model of health, community development and disease prevention approach.
- Knowledge of both Acute and Primary Health sectors and ability to navigate both the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) and My Aged Care (MAC) systems.
- Excellent written and oral communication, IT and time management skills.
- Demonstrated ability to work independently and as part of a multi-disciplinary Allied Health Team, with ability to develop partnerships with other health and community care providers (E.g. GPs).
- Experience in developing, delivering and evaluating evidence-based nursing services and health promotion initiatives that are responsive to the needs of priority population groups.
- Ability to problem solve in a variety of complex situations.

Expected behaviours for all YourCH team members and volunteers

- Work in partnership with the community, clients and staff to achieve our vision
- Ensure a safe workplace for clients, visitors and staff
